

The program, now in its third year, aims to empower women by promoting women's leadership and influence through gender equality, access to opportunities and inclusivity. Through a number of initiatives including white papers, round tables and podcasts, the program dives into the challenges women face in the ever-demanding, technology-driven world of work, and addresses the opportunities women can seize to reinvent and transform the workplace from their own unique, collaborative and resourceful perspective. Based on this and other initiatives, Randstad Canada has been recognized multiple times as one of the "Best Workplaces in Canada for Women" by the Great Place to Work Institute. In addition, Randstad Canada was awarded in 2019 an Achievement in Communications Excellence for the Women Transforming the Workplace program from the Canadian Public Relations Society and received Bronze Certification from Women in Governance as part of its Gender Parity Certification program.
